



St George's Scavenger Hunt

St. George's was founded in 1612 and is the earliest example of an English urban settlement in the world. Although it has grown over the last four centuries, many buildings are preserved in their original form. It is for these reasons that St. George's a UNESCO World Heritage Site.



We invite you to get challenged with our Scavenger Hunt and take in some of the town's unique history on the way!

→ Start at King's Square

1. Find the first Governor's house Clue: Stand in King's Square with your back to the Town Hall and walk across the square to HSBC bank. Read the plaque on the wall.	Who was Bermuda's first governor? What dates was he here?
2. Find Bridge House Clue: With your back to HSBC, cross King's Square. Turn left onto Bridge Street and stop at the gates to Bridge House on the right. Look for the plaques on the gateposts.	Name the Governor of Bermuda who lived there.
3. Find State House Clue: Come back down Bridge Street, turn left at the end and go to the top of the brick paved road.	When was State House built? What was it used for? Who uses it today?
4. Find Samaritan's Lodge Clue: Come back down the brick path the way you came. At the bottom of the path turn left and walk to the eastern end of Water Street. Find the last building on the right.	What is its name? What do the letters ADHT stand for? What is the building used for today?
5. Find Somer's Gardens Clue: Cross over the main road and head west until you reach the entrance to Somer's Gardens. Go into the gardens.	Whose heart is buried somewhere in this garden?
6. Find John Stephenson's Memorial. Clue: Come out of the garden and continue walking west on the main road. Turn right at the junction, then turn left onto Featherbed Alley. Find the African Diaspora Heritage Trail (ADHT) plaque on the wall of the first building on the right.	Tell the story written on the plaque.
7. Find St Peter's Graveyard Clue: Continue to walk up Featherbed Alley and cross over the road to Church Lane. Find the entrance to the graveyard on your left and go in.	What is the oldest date you can find on a grave?
8. Find James Darrell's House Clue: Come out of the graveyard the way you came. At the end of the lane turn left and then turn right onto Needle and Thread Alley. Walk along until you see James Darrell's House on your right.	Read the ADHT plaque. When and why was James Darrell given his freedom?
9. Find Tucker House Clue: Head down Needle and Thread Alley towards the main road. Cross over the main road and head down Barber's Alley. At the bottom, turn right.	Who lived in this house and when? Who owns this house today?
10. Find Ordnance Island Clue: Head east down Water Street until you reach King's Square. Turn right and head across the bridge.	Whose statue is in the centre of the island? What is the name of the replica ship? What sorts of punishments from the past can you see?
